

Special needs grant for stay abroad with own child(ren)

Going abroad with your child(ren)

EXTRA FUNDING

- Social top-up of **200€ per month**
- Additional to the regular Erasmus+ grant
- PROOF
- Birth certificate(s) of your child(ren)
- Child(ren)s travel documents or a proof of childcare abroad
- → Scans sent via e-mail are sufficient

Eligibility

You are eligible to this grant, if you plan to go abroad with your child(ren).

Benefit

If you apply for this special needs grant you have the opportunity to receive the social top-up of extra 200€ per month additional to the general Erasmus+ grant during your whole stay abroad.

Application

The application process is very simple:

- You only need to send us an e-mail to <u>tumerasmus@zv.tum.de</u> expressing your wish to receive this grant together with a scan of the birth certificate of your child(ren) who you plan to take with you during your stay abroad, before starting your mobility.
- 2) You will receive a confirmation of us that you will receive the grant and sign a different grant agreement than students who do not receive a special needs grant.
- 3) You will receive a social top-up of proportionally additional 200€ per month included into your first Erasmus+ grant installment (70% of the full grant amount) with reservation of proof.
- 4) You need to send us a copy of either the travel documents of your child(ren) (outbound and return) OR a copy of a proof of childcare abroad during your stay abroad (e.g. confirmation of a kindergarden) to <u>tumerasmus@zv.tum.de</u>.
- 5) After the travel documents of your child(ren)/ proof of childcare along with the usual after mobility documents have been examined by the Global & Alumni Office, you will receive the second installment of your Erasmus+ grant (30% of the full grant amount) together with the social top-up of proportionally additional 200€ per month.



Please let us know in good time and preferably before the official grant agreement (GA) submission, if you would like to receive this grant as you will sign another Erasmus+ Grant Agreement than students who do not receive a special needs grant (GA: contract about Erasmus+ stay and grant).
