The Partnach Gorge (in German: Partnachklamm) is a deep gorge that has been incised by a mountain stream, the Partnach, in the Reintal valley near the south German town of Garmisch-Partenkirchen.

Together, we will explore the gorge, which is 702 meters long and, in places, over 80 meters deep. Besides the green wild river, the rocky trail will lead us past steep cliffs, waterfalls and tunnels. Come with us to experience one of Bavaria's most beautiful natural monuments and gaze at its unique landscape and mysterious atmosphere.
