Munich Marathon

The so called "Olympia City Marathon", designed as a city marathon, has been the first marathon in Munich since the Olympic Games in 1972. In2015, Munich Marathon was able to record a new entrant record on its 30th anniversary with almost 23,000 participants from 58 nations. Munich, as a city of sports, will support the largest marathon event in Southern Germany again in 2017 as a cooperation partner and wishes all participants of the 32nd Edition of Munich Marathon, taking place on October 8, a unique experience.

In the south of Germany there are annual fairs called "Dults". Originally started for religious reasons, they developed into a friendly get-together for all kinds of people. The Kirchweihdult is the third and last Dult this year. The traditional open-air market offers household products and a great variety of second-hand wares and antiquities. There are also Merry-go-rounds and a beer tent for entertainment. Around 300 marketers and showmen attract different people, who often attend the spectacle in their Bavarian garb.

Steven Tevels: Solanum Tuberosum Sound Synthesis

Solanum Tuberosum Sound Synthesis by the Belgian artist Steven Tevels is a series of sound art installations composed of a chain of oscillators – or sound sources – running through filters – or potatoes – which signals are then sent to an amplifier for gain staging. The main idea behind Sound Synthesis resides in the fact that all conceivable sounds can be produced by electronic oscillators. In other words, it is the art of creating sound in an artificial way. The artist creates his personal experimental – and playful – environment in which he can manipulate electrical



signals and then turn them into sound waves by means of speakers.

Little "How do Germans tick" Guide: German Unity Day

The Day of German Unity (Tag der Deutschen Einheit) is a public holiday and held annually on October 3 to celebrate the unification of Germany. After World War II Germany was divided into four military sectors controlled by France, the United Kingdom, the United States and the Soviet Union. On May 23, 1949, the sectors controlled by France, the UK and the US became the Federal Republic of Germany (Bundesrepublik Deutschland). On October 7, 1949, the sector controlled by the Soviet Union became the German Democratic Republic

(Deutsche Demokratische Republik, DDR).



Due to the political tension during the cold war, the authorities of the GDR started to set up a guarded concrete barrier that physically and ideologically divided East from West Germany as well as East from West Berlin from 1961 to 1989.

Officially, the GDR referred to the Berlin Wall as the Anti-Fascist Protection Rampart. Up till the 9th of November 1989 the citizens of East Germany were forbidden to travel to countries, which did not belong to the Soviet Union and its satellite states including West Germany. After the checkpoints were opened and the citizen gained the right to travel it took only one year until the official reunification of Germany took place on October the 3rd 1990.
