The Max Planck Institute for Physics warmly invites all those who are curious about particle physics to visit them at their research institute. They will introduce you to their experiments and will show you, for example, how a gamma radiation telescope works, explain why chilly temperatures are needed in the search for dark matter, and enable you to experience how scientists use the ATLAS detector in their work at CERN. In addition, the topics will deal with very fundamental questions as well: Which elementary particles are known and why are physicists looking for new particles? What exactly is radioactivity, and where does it occur? There will also be exciting talks on current research topics. For children, the program will include a painting competition. And under the motto "Build your own particle detector", they will invite children (and adults as well, of course) to take part in a Lego competition. The best creations will win a prize! Little "How do Germans tick" Guide: BBQing in Germany and Munich

If hamburgers come to your mind when you think of barbecuing, then you might be surprised when you meet up with your German friends for a "Grillabend". Even though the beef patties may be named after a northern German city, you'll rather find all kind of sausages and every cut of pork on a German BBQ than a hamburger. On the side you will find homemade (potato) salads, (garlic) breads, dips like avocado or yogurt, fruits and beer to go with the meat! The general rule in Germany is that in blocks of flats, where other people could be directly affected by the smoke or smell, you are only allowed to grill once a month. If you want to grill more often during the summer months just make sure not to bother your neighbors, let them know in advance or move your grill to the other side of the garden.
